CONTINUING EDUCATION

On Tuesday, January 26, 2021, CSHP, in partnership with Paradigm hosted, a virtual CE program, "New Directions in Influenza Management: The Pharmacist's Guide to Patient Identification, Testing, and Antiviral Use". There was a good turnout with over 30 attendees who had the privilege of learning from Katherine Lusardi, PharmD: an antimicrobial stewardship pharmacist from Arkansas.

During the CE, Dr. Lusardi discussed influenza transmission and clinical progression. She also was able to provide some helpful tips on differentiating influenza from other respiratory illnesses, including colds and Covid-19. Dr. Lusardi went on to discuss testing options, including the advantages and disadvantages of each. The final portion of the CE was spent evaluating currently approved antiviral therapies for influenza and their potential place in therapy. A brief review of some of the key literature surrounding antiviral therapy was discussed. Dr. Lusardi did a masterful job of explaining some of the key differences between medications and closed out the presentation with some practical counseling points.

CSHP would like to thank Dr. Lusardi, Paradigm, and all of those that attended our event on this timely topic.

The Passing of Paul G. Pierpaoli

Paul G. Pierpaoli died at his home in Hilton Head, SC, on December 17, 2020, after a long and valiant battle with Parkinson's disease. In his honor, CSHP presents the Paul G. Pierpaoli Award annually to a "CSHP member of the highest integrity who best exemplifies the profession of pharmacy through significant contributions, of a long-term nature, to the practice of pharmacy in Connecticut and the development of high standards of pharmacy practice".

Paul Pierpaoli began his career in 1962 at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) Clinical Center in Bethesda, Maryland, as assistant to the chief pharmacist. During his long and varied career, spanning over 60 years, he served as a professor and director of pharmacy at numerous institutions, including UCONN Health Center, VCU Medical Center, and Rush University Medical Center, Chicago. He transitioned to industry as senior vice president for pharmacy practice at McKesson Medication Management, a position he held until 2006.

He was a prolific author, served as a board member and national president of ASHP, received the Whitney Award, his profession's highest honor, and trained well over 100 residents. As well, he was the recipient of distinguished alumnus awards by both his alma maters, The University of Rhode Island and The University of Michigan. He was the first in his family to complete high school, college, and graduate school. He spoke often and passionately about the importance of human dignity and believed that all human labor, no matter the level, was innately noble.
